- Supplemental Ordinance

Currently our seasonal maintenance employees once hired will only have a total of 19 weeks which would end their season in August. The departments operational need require seasonal employees to work a minimum of 25 weeks. This supplemental appropriation will allow for our upcoming employees to work from mid-April - October
