RESOLUTION 2015-046

A RESOLUTION SPECIFYING THE MUNICIPAL SERVICES TO BE FURNISHED TO 128.134 ACRES MORE OR LESS, WHICH IS PENDING ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF PATASKALA

WHEREAS, Connie J. Klema, agent for Petitioners, has presented a certain petition to the Licking County Commissioners seeking annexation of 128.134 acres, more or less, to the City of Pataskala, on June 23, 2015; and

WHEREAS, Section 709.023(C) requires the legislative authority of the municipal corporation to which annexation is proposed to adopt a Resolution stating what services the municipal corporation will provide, and an approximate date by which it will provide them, to the territory proposed for annexation, upon annexation, which legislation must be adopted within twenty (20) days after the date that the petition is filed; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF PATASKALA, COUNTY OF LICKING, STATE OF OHIO, A MAJORITY OF ITS MEMBERS CONCURRING THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> Upon annexation of the subject premises to the City of Pataskala, the City will furnish at a minimum the following City services, said services shall be provided under the same conditions and the same costs as they are provided to other residents in the City of Pataskala:

- A. Twenty-Four (24) Hour police protection.
- B. Fire protection provided by West Licking Joint Fire Department.
- C. Sanitary Sewer service. The water reclamation facility is rated to treat an average daily flow of 1.1 million gallons per day with a maximum capacity of 3.7 MGD design. The average flow in 2014 was .735 million gallons per day (67% capacity). The plant is 1.1 million gallons per day activated sludge facility with secondary wet stream treatment and sludge processing equipment. The facility is designed to expand to an average of 2.2 million gallons per day. The collection system consists of 7 sanitary pump stations and 32 miles of main inventory. This

property will be served by gravity sewers for conveyance and treatment at the facility. Sanitary sewer service will be provided to the property by the extension of existing lines to the property.

- D. Water service. The City has two water treatment plants. Water Treatment Plant #1 (south of the City on S.R. 310) and Water Treatment Plant #2 (intersection of Watkins and Refugee Road) will service the property. Water Treatment Plant #1 operates at a design capacity of 1.3 million gallons per day, and Water Treatment Plant #2 operates with a design capacity of .864 million gallons per day. The combined average daily flow production in 2014 was .763 million gallons per day (36% of the total design production capacity). Water systems consist of a combined 2.164 million gallons per day with 2 well fields (6 wells), iron removal, ion exchange softening, disinfection, 3000,000 gallons of combined water treatment storage at treatment facilities. The distribution system consists of 55 miles of main line inventory, 4 water towers with a combined capacity of 1.4 million gallons, and 1 water booster station (3 pumps) which will provide water service to this area. Water service will be provided to the property by the extension of existing lines to the property.
- E. Street maintenance and repair.
- F. Planning and zoning supervision.
- G. Parks and recreation.

<u>Section 2</u>. That the Clerk of Council file a certified copy of this resolution hereby adopted, to the Board of Commissioners of Licking County, Ohio, within twenty (20) days after the date the annexation petition is filed.

Section 3. That this Resolution shall take effect at the earliest possible date permitted by law.
