- Parks Advisory Board meetings being held in park in 2022
 - Starting in April, we will be holding 1 of our bi-monthly meetings in each of our 7 parks.. We will highlight each park and engage the community and collect data for future use as the community grows. More information will be given at next council meeting regarding our goal of the meetings. See attached schedule. We hope to see ward representatives present in the parks.

> Project updates

- Aeration of Ponds: Service will be added soon waiting on Contractor (CS Electric) AEP)
 - Only completing Liberty Park this season. Citizens Park will be delayed due to Headwall construction being planned this summer
- Security Cameras: Final quote has been approved. We are added camera systems in Foundation Park, Municipal Park and Freedom Park. In 2023 we will add cameras to the other parks with the funds currently in the CIP budget.
- o **Ice Machines**: Installed April 13th.
- o **Pool Pump:** New Pump/motor has been installed
 - Pool Pre-Season Prep work began the April 18th
 - Planning to fill pool on May 10th
 - **AEP:** The blown transformer had been has been fixed as of April 22nd
 - Backflow valve check #2: Fixed
- o **Foundation Park: Athletic Field Development Project:** Preliminary planning for the future of our parks and recreation program growth. Parking will be included in the plan as well.
 - We are in the process of obtaining a feasibility study for Foundation Park open space. The goal of this study is to add additional fields to help with our existing programs (Soccer). These additional fields will also be a resource for other leagues within the community who need open athletic field space for practices and games. We are working with Verdantas to obtain a site image of the site work. This feasibility study will be completed by September 2022. Athletic field improvements are currently in our unfunded CIP.
- O Citizens Park planning: The goal this year is to apply for a nature works grant for this park. We are waiting on site plan from Midstate Recreation. We are writing the grant to engineer the area and do the following in 2024: The nature works grant is a 25% allocation from the city. The goal would be to apply for improvement two years in a row.
- The second meeting in May I will have a resolution to apply for said Nature Works Grant and more details regarding the application/improvements
 - Add/Upgrade Parking lot on site
 - Add caged basketball court

- Add an aggregate walking path around the perimeter of the park and connect to Faith Ann (Taylor Rd)
- Grade field area to add greenspace so that its usable space for the West Side of Pataskala. Athletic Fields


