#### July 5, 2022 Council Meeting

#### **Unfinished Business**

##### A. Ordinances

➤ **ORDINANCE 2022- 4421 – 3<sup>rd</sup> READING**

The rezoning request is for a total of 38.32 acres comprised of three separate properties located on Refugee Road. On February 11, 2022, the owners of the properties met with staff and the Chairperson of the Development Committee to discuss the possibility of the City rezoning the properties, on the owners' behalf, from the R-87 – Medium-Low Density Residential District to the PM – Planned Manufacturing District. In doing so, the properties would be appropriately zoned for development in the area, would be aligned with the land use recommendation from the Comprehensive Plan, and would match the zoning of surrounding properties. The owners agreed to the rezoning proposal and collectively signed a letter in support. On February 24, 2022, the Development Committee met to discuss the rezoning proposal and recommended that the application proceed through the rezoning process. On April 6, 2022, Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the proposed rezoning.

➤ **RESOLUTION 2022-065 – A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE A USE AGREEMENT WITH LICKING COUNTY ALCAHOL PREVENTION PROGRAM (LAPP)**

Historically the Licking County Alcohol Prevention Program (LAPP) has been a long-term tenant of 621 W. Broad St. In 2021 when their lease expired LAPP decided

to only do a 1-year lease of the room 1 E consisting of approximately 1,484 total useable square feet. LAPP notified the City Administration in April 2022 that they were interested in expanding to a 3-year lease. This legislation allows for the City Administrator to enter into that 3-year lease.

➤ **RESOLUTION 2022-067 - A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH MOTOROLA SOLUTIONS TO PURCHASE NINETEEN BODY-WORN CAMERAS AND EVIDENCE MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE.**

The City of Pataskala Division of Police currently has thirteen body-worn cameras which were purchased in 2018. Because these cameras are used often, they can use only five of the thirteen cameras at any one time. Pataskala Police Department would like the City to purchase an additional nineteen body-worn cameras and evidence management software from Motorola Solutions under a 5-year contract. The total cost of the 5-year contract is \$62,980.00. However, payments will be divided equally over a 5-year period. Therefore, the amount due during the 2022 budget year is \$13,796.00 and the remaining payments for 2023 to 2026 will be \$12,296.00. The Pataskala Police will purchase these body-worn cameras from Motorola Solutions as part of the State of Ohio Competitive Purchasing Program. The costs for the years 2023, 2024, 2025, and 2026 will be incorporated as part of the Capital Improvement budget.
